Lithuania

From July 3-12 Travis and I will be traveling to Lithuania to participate in the TAFISA games. Gary Roberts OH will also be coming along. The three of us plan on introducing horseshoe pitching to the other 130 countries that are participating. Since our trip to South Africa and our participation in their indigenous sport of Jukskei we have together decided to join forces as a group and call it, "Precision Throwing Sports". Along with Horseshoe Pitching and Jukskei we eventually hope to include Bocce, and Petanque, to become a force to be reckoned with. In order to get any recognition on a world wide basis we feel that this partnership will be worthwhile. The eventual goal is that these Precision Throwing Sports become recognized by the international community as viable sports and worthy of Olympic consideration.

At the 2013 World Horseshoe Pitching Championships, in St. George, UT we intend on having an International Jukskei Tournament with both South Africans and Namibians attending. We anticipate that each country will send a team of Jukskei players and that some of them will also participate in the WT as horseshoe pitchers. There is also a plan to return to South Africa with a US Jukskei team to participate in their Jukskei Championship in 2013 and further strengthen our relationship with those two countries.

Regional Director

Thanks to all the clubs who have returned the blue court sanctioning forms. Those of you who have not will need to add another 1-cent stamp to the envelope. Those that have returned their court sanctioning forms can look forward to first choices in tournament dates. I need to hear from the rest real soon.

The dismal turnouts at most tournaments are due to people not traveling to other clubs. To remedy this the NCHPA should limit the number of tournament per weekend. Here is what I propose: *no more than two (2) tournaments per weekend regardless of history. The distance apart must be 200 miles or more.* Some fodder for the annual mtg. This pitching schedule thing has gotten completely out of hand.

Please get ready to send you next year's tournament requests to Casey? They need to be in my hands by **October 1, 2012**

Do you know the rules?

Section D – Seeding Contestants

Contestants shall be seeded into Tournament Classes based on their current NatStats ringer percentage at the time of the entry deadline. An exception could be the top seeding of a defending champion (not required) when his/her current NatStats ringer percentage isn't the highest percentage within the Championship group. All NatStats average ringer percentages shall be based on the three (3) highest NHPA sanctioned events pitched in the preceding twelve (12) months, or among the last ten (10) sanctioned events pitched during the same period, whichever occurs first. The NatStats average ringer percentage is calculated by dividing the total number of ringers by the total number of shoes pitched for those three (3) events. If a Sanctioned League ringer average is one of the three (3) highest NHPA sanctioned events, that Sanctioned League ringer average shall be converted to an average that is based on four hundred (400) shoes.

This rule is very clear in the way contestants are to be seeded into tournament Classes. We have received reports that some Tournament Directors are using other methods to seed contestants, and if so, those practices cannot continue.

Chester Harvey Carter

Born April 5, 1917 - Died June 9, 2012

Resident of San Jose, California
Son of Frank and Irene Carter (Smith). Chet was born in San Jose, California and was the brother to Alvin and Clifford Carter. Chet was

wed to Florence Carter for 42 years. Chet and Florence bought their first house on Milton Way in Willow Glen in 1941. For the next 71 years, Chet resided in Willow Glen.

Chet was raised on a ranch in Cupertino of which his driveway is now Stelling Avenue. Chet attended Fremont High School and graduated from San Jose Technical High School where he learned the trade of welding.

Chet went on to work for San Jose Well and Pump and worked for them for 8 years. Chet then used his welding skills repairing damaged ships in the U.S. Navy. He went back to work for San Jose Well and Pump for a short time then began running his own business, Baldwin and Carter. Subsequently, he then worked for Pittsburgh Des Moine Steel Company for 24 years. After the closing of the plant in Santa Clara, Chet worked for PSP Steel Company for 10 years.

Throughout his life Chet was very competitive participating in football, baseball, and track at Fremont High School. The competitiveness carried over to his interest in car racing in the early 1950's. He held a track record in his class racing a modified roadster at Little Bonnevillie drag strip on King Road. Chet is best known for his involvement in the racing community for being a starter at Fremont Dragstrip beginning in 1957 later to become Baylands raceway. Chet rarely missed a Sunday driving to Fremont Dragstrip in his modified 1921 Ford Touring. One of Chet's proudest moments was being cast in the film "More American Graffiti." Chet played himself as the starter at the drag strip.

Along with racing Chet had a passion for playing horseshoes. This began with his family playing horseshoes at family gatherings and going on to compete with the Golden Eagles

Horseshoe Club of San Jose winning many trophies in his class. Chet traveled the state in his later years and was a member of the horseshoe club for over 50 years. Chet will be remembered for good nature joking around and bantering with anyone who would engage him. Chet was feisty and could remember names and dates better than many people half his age. An avid sports fan he followed the Giants from the time they came to Candlestick in the late fifties and if you didn't know the starting pitcher that particular day he wouldn't hesitate to correct you. Chet truly enjoyed the sport of drag racing and could often be found watching the races on T.V.

Chet is survived by his son, Jim Carter (Terri) and daughter, Linda Carter Wallerstein (Larry), four grandchildren, Seth, Kyle (Nicole), Allison and Chad; two step-grandchildren Jennifer and Katherine; two great grandchildren Bella and Levi; and good friend Teresa Thomas.

Many of us have talked about increasing membership and tournament attendance. This is part of our marketing plan. Most newspapers have a section for clubs and activities. Make sure your club is listed in as many newspapers in your county or nearby cities as possible. Also, if any of these cities have community TV channels, you might be able to have your club activities listed on their bulletin board. We like to make labels with a picture of the member

our tournament is named after. We then place the label on a product of our choice. We use the relabeled product as one of the raffle gifts. This label art work can be used in a mass e-mail to members as a reminder for your upcoming event or for a press release that a tournament is about to take place. I recommend that you start taking individual digital photos of all your members and players and store them on your computer. You will always have a use for them. Always take digital photos during the warm up before your tournament starts. This is the time to stage your photos (without bothering your players) for your press release when you give your tournament results. Remember, if you can get your tournament in the paper twice, you double the exposure to gaining new members.

We do have a stigma of being professional horseshoe players, making new members reluctant to join. Try having a tournament possibly named after a historic person, event, or a fictitious person. I am going to help my Moose lodge install Horseshoe courts. They want to get as many members playing shoes as possible. We are going to use what I call jungle rules, 3 points for every ringer, 2 points for a leaner, 1 point six inches away or the closest shoe scores a point no matter where it is in the pit. Fouled shoes will also count for points. We will post the NHPA scoring next to the Jungle rules, so everyone will know the difference. You want new players to be successful while having fun. I also found that most people like

a doubles. I plan to use this format as a recruiting tool for our NHPA Club. You have to think outside the box! Remember, it's easier to gain new members when they show up and have fun.
